PLANNING MOBILITY

When planning a **teaching mobility (Erasmus+ STA) or other teaching visit**, it is important to schedule the stay during the **teaching period of the semester**, so that the faculty can ensure the participation of students in the classes.

Due to the organization of the academic year and the fact that students often attend **block practical placements**, the availability of students may be limited outside regular teaching weeks. For this reason, visits planned during examination periods or practice blocks may not allow sufficient student participation.

When proposing a teaching visit, we kindly ask incoming teachers to send **2–3 possible dates** for the mobility. This helps the host institute and the faculty coordinator to select a suitable term and prepare the teaching programme accordingly.

The **University of South Bohemia in České Budějovice (USB)** is a public university founded in **1991**. It consists of **8 faculties** offering programmes in humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, health sciences, economics, education, theology and other fields. The university has about **9,000 students**.

The **Faculty of Health and Social Sciences (FHSS)** was also established in **1991** and provides education in health care, social work, public health, physiotherapy, nursing, midwifery and related disciplines.

The Faculty is an institution that truly lives up to its motto: **WE TEACH PEOPLE TO HELP**. Thanks to this, the faculty trains students for whom their profession can become their mission. A demanding mission, but a mission that allows them to lead fulfilling lives.

ACCOMMODATION

České Budějovice offers a wide range of accommodation, from hotels in the city centre to smaller guesthouses and budget options. Prices may vary depending on the season. The options below are commonly used by **visiting teachers, guests and Erasmus+ staff**.

[Clarion Congress Hotel České Budějovice](#)

Modern 4-star hotel located near the city centre, within walking distance of the main square. Offers comfortable rooms, restaurant, and conference facilities. Suitable for official guests and longer stays.

Approx. price: 2,000 – 3,500 CZK / night



[Grandhotel Zvon](#)

Historic hotel located directly on Přemysl Otakar II Square, the main square of the city. Comfortable rooms, restaurant, and excellent location in the centre.

Approx. price: 1,800 – 3,200 CZK / night



[Hotel Budweis](#)

4-star hotel close to the historical centre and the river. Quiet location, modern rooms, suitable for university guests.

Approx. price: 1,800 – 3,000 CZK / night



[Spa Hotel Vita / Residence variants nearby](#)

Several smaller hotels and residences are located near the university and city centre and offer good value for medium-term stays. Approx. price: 1,200 – 2,500 CZK / night

[Pension U Černé věže](#)

Small guesthouse in the historical centre, close to the Black Tower. Simple but comfortable accommodation, good for short stays.

Approx. price: 1,000 – 1,800 CZK / night



[Pension Klika](#)

Guesthouse located near the river and close to the city centre. Quiet environment, suitable for guests who prefer smaller accommodation.

Approx. price: 1,200 – 2,000 CZK / night

Hotel located between the city centre and the Faculty of Health and Social Sciences, in a convenient and quiet area. The location allows easy access both to the faculty and to the historical centre

ARRIVAL AND TRANSPORT

Students coming for a study mobility are strongly recommended to **arrive 1–2 days before the Orientation Week (OW)** and to take part in the programme. During **Orientation Week** you will receive many useful practical and academic information about studying and living in České Budějovice, and it is also a great opportunity to meet both international and Czech students.

Please **always inform the FHSS Erasmus+ faculty coordinator about the date and expected time of your arrival.**



By Plane to Prague – Václav Havel Airport (PRG)

Recommended option: Direct FlixBus to České Budějovice

If the timetable fits your flight, the easiest option is a direct FlixBus from Prague Airport to České Budějovice Bus Station. No transfer in Prague is needed.

- ♥ **Journey time:** from approximately 3 hours 15 minutes
- ♥ **Ticket:** buy online or in the FlixBus app; prices vary according to date and booking time
- ♥ **No printout is needed** – the QR code on your phone is sufficient
- ♥ **Always check** the exact airport stop and departure time shown on your ticket

Alternative: Airport Express + direct train

1. Airport Express (AE): Prague Airport → Prague Main Railway Station

- ♥ **Journey time:** approximately 40 minutes
- ♥ **Fare:** 200 CZK; tickets can be bought from the driver, including card payment
- ♥ **Luggage:** free of charge
- ♥ **The Airport Express** boarding stop at the airport is in front of Terminal 1

2. Direct train: Prague Main Railway Station (Praha hlavní nádraží) → České Budějovice

- ♥ **Direct České dráhy trains** normally take about 1 hour 40 minutes; slower services may take around 2 hours
- ♥ **Ticket prices vary** according to the connection and booking conditions; check the current price before travelling
- ♥ **Tickets can be purchased** online, in the ČD app, at the ticket office or at station ticket machines

Budget alternative: Prague public transport

For a cheaper journey from the airport into Prague, use the regular Prague public transport system. This option involves more transfers and is therefore less convenient with heavy luggage.

- ♥ **Trolleybus 59:** Prague Airport → Nádraží Veleslavín (Metro A), approximately 15 minutes
- ♥ **Bus 100:** Prague Airport → Zličín (Metro B), approximately 18 minutes
- ♥ **Tickets must be purchased** before boarding. The PID Lítačka app can also be used for journey planning and tickets.

Where to buy tickets

Tickets are valid on metro, tram, bus, ferry and train lines in the area of Prague. Short-term tickets for Prague (from 30 minutes to 3 days) can be purchased in following ways:

- ♥ In information centers and selling points at most of the metro stations
- ♥ In yellow ticket vending machines at metro stations and some surface transit stops
- ♥ In newspaper shops in the whole area of Prague
- ♥ In the mobile application PID Lítačka (paid by credit/debit card, Masterpass or Apple Pay, ticket needs to be activated before your travel)
- ♥ Inside every tram (only by contactless credit/debit card)

How to use the tickets

If you are using a paper ticket, it must be validated immediately after boarding the bus or trolleybus.

Insert the ticket into the yellow validation machine inside the vehicle.

If the ticket is not validated, it is considered invalid and the passenger may be treated as travelling without a valid ticket. Each ticket must be validated only once; when changing between lines or individual means, do not validate the ticket again. **Avoid the Penalty!**



By Plane to Vienna International Airport (VIE)

Another convenient way to reach České Budějovice is via Vienna International Airport. Depending on your flight arrival time, you can continue either by direct long-distance bus or by train via Linz.

Recommended option: Direct FlixBus

A direct FlixBus connects Vienna Airport with České Budějovice. This is usually the simplest option because no transfer is required.

- ♥ **Journey time:** from approximately 4 hours 50 minutes
- ♥ **Ticket:** buy online or in the FlixBus app; prices vary according to date and booking time
- ♥ **The exact departure point** is shown on your ticket
- ♥ **The bus arrives** at České Budějovice Bus Station, located on the roof of the Mercury shopping centre next to the railway station

Alternative: Train via Linz

1. Railjet: Vienna Airport (Flughafen Wien) → Linz Hbf

- ♥ **Direct Railjet journey:** approximately 1 hour 41 minutes
- ♥ **Services normally** run at frequent intervals; check the current timetable before departure
- ♥ **The railway platforms** at Vienna Airport are directly accessible from the Arrivals Hall

2. Linz Hbf → České Budějovice

- ♥ **Continue by a direct international train** towards České Budějovice / Prague when available
- ♥ **Allow approximately 4 hours** in total from Vienna Airport to České Budějovice, depending on the connection and transfer time
- ♥ **Do not rely on a fixed fare** – international train prices depend on the connection and booking conditions

After Arrival in České Budějovice

The **main railway station** and the **bus station** are next to each other. The bus station is located on the roof of the **Mercury shopping centre**. In front of the station you will find the main public transport stop “**Nádraží**”, from which you can reach both the Faculty of Health and Social Sciences and the main University Campus.



Important: The Faculty of Health and Social Sciences (FHSS) is **not** located on the main University Campus. If you use a taxi, Bolt or Liftago, always enter the exact address **J. Boreckého 1167/27, České Budějovice**.

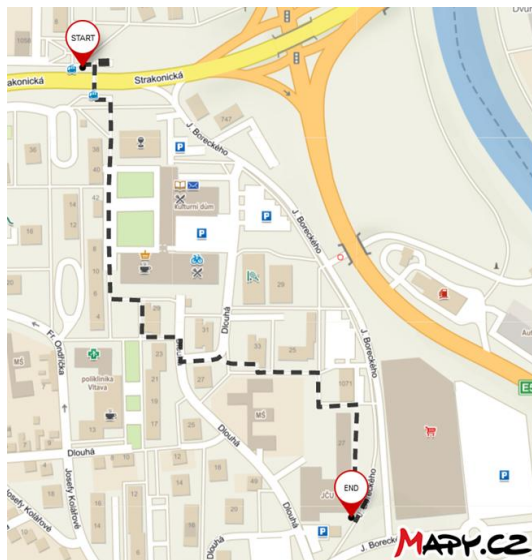
Public Transport in České Budějovice

Public transport in České Budějovice is operated by **DPMCB** (Dopravní podnik města České Budějovice), the city transport company. It operates buses and trolleybuses throughout the city. For current connections, use **IDOS** or the official **DPMCB timetables**.

How to Get to the Main Faculty Building (FHSS)

Faculty address: J. Boreckého 1167/27, 370 11 České Budějovice.

- ♥ **Recommended option:** lines 5, 8, 9, 14, 18 → “Vltava střed” (approximately 15 minutes), then about **8–10 minutes on foot** to FHSS.
- ♥ **Alternative:** lines 1, 5, 15, 18, 25 → “Evžena Rošického” (approximately 14–18 minutes), then about **6 minutes on foot** to FHSS.
- ♥ **Taxi:** use a taxi, Bolt or Liftago if you have heavy luggage or prefer a direct ride. Always show the exact FHSS address.

How to Get to the University Campus

- ♥ **Public transport:** lines 3, 7, 15, 25 → “Jihočeská univerzita”

Important: the same line number may run in two different directions. Before boarding, check the **list of stops on the timetable at the bus/trolleybus stop**.

Find your current stop in the list and make sure that your destination – for example “Evžena Rošického” – appears **among the following stops**. If it does not, you are probably waiting in the wrong direction.

The display on the front of the bus or trolleybus usually shows the **final destination of the line**, not your intermediate stop.

How to Buy a Ticket

For occasional travel, there are two practical options: **virtual ticket in the vehicle** or **paper ticket from a machine**.

Virtual Ticket (contactless payment in a bus or trolleybus)

- ♥ All DPMCB buses and trolleybuses have contactless ticket terminals.
- ♥ The terminal can be switched to **English**.
- ♥ If you simply tap your card without selecting a ticket first, the system automatically buys a **full-fare 60-minute ticket**.
- ♥ If you want another ticket type, choose it on the screen first, then tap your **bank card, phone or smartwatch**.
- ♥ **No paper ticket is printed**. Your ticket is electronic and linked to the same card or device used for payment.
- ♥ When changing to another bus or trolleybus, you do **not** need to buy another ticket if your ticket is still valid.
- ♥ To check your valid ticket, select **My Tickets** on the terminal and tap the same card or device again.

Paper Ticket

- ♥ Paper tickets are available from ticket machines at selected stops.
- ♥ A paper ticket must be **validated immediately after boarding** the bus or trolleybus.
- ♥ Insert the ticket into the yellow validation machine inside the vehicle.
- ♥ Do **not** validate the same paper ticket again when changing vehicles, as long as it is still valid.

Ticket Inspection

Ticket inspectors (*revizoři*) regularly check tickets on buses and trolleybuses.

- ♥ During an inspection, follow the inspector's instructions and present the **same card, phone or smartwatch** used to buy the virtual ticket.
- ♥ If you used a **physical bank card**, show that card. If you used a **phone** or **smartwatch**, show that device.
- ♥ If you use a **paper ticket**, keep it with you until the end of your journey.
- ♥ **Once a ticket inspection has started, it is no longer possible to buy a ticket.**

MONEY TALK

In the Czech Republic, there are Czech Crowns (CZK) are used as an official currency

1 CZK = 100 Halers. Notes come in 5000, 2000, 1000, 500, 200 and 100 CZK denominations and coins in 50, 20, 10, 5, 2, and 1 CZK.

The Czech crown is freely convertible on world currency markets; exchange rates could be found [HERE](#).



How to exchange money?

- ♥ **Exchange Offices** Many exchange offices in tourist areas advertise 0% commission, but always check the final exchange rate before completing the transaction. Always check the displayed exchange rate and final amount before confirming the transaction.
- ♥ **Banks** Some banks offer currency exchange services, usually during their opening hours: typically Monday–Friday, approximately 8:00–17:00. However, banks often offer less favourable exchange rates than exchange offices and may charge additional fees.
- ♥ **ATMs** Many international students prefer to withdraw Czech crowns directly from ATMs using their bank card. ATMs are widely available in airports, city centres, shopping centres and near banks. When withdrawing money, you may be offered dynamic currency conversion. It is usually better to decline this option and withdraw in CZK, as the exchange rate is often more favourable.

TIME AND PUNCTUALITY IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

In the Czech Republic, **people usually take time quite seriously**. Being on time is considered polite and respectful. If a meeting, class or appointment is scheduled for 10:00 a.m., it normally means exactly 10:00 a.m., not later. Arriving a few minutes early is common and appreciated.

This applies especially to university classes, meetings with teachers, medical appointments, and official offices. If you know you will be late, it is polite to inform the person you are meeting in advance.

Public transport in Czech cities also runs according to fixed timetables. Buses and trams usually arrive and leave on time, so it is good to check the schedule and plan your journey accordingly.

Working Hours and Opening Times

Opening hours of museums, monuments and tourist sites are usually between 9 or 10 a.m. and 5 or 6 p.m. Many museums, galleries and castles are closed on Mondays, so it is always a good idea to check the opening hours before you go. If you plan to visit a castle, keep in mind that the last guided tour usually starts about one hour to one and a half hours before closing time.

The National Museum in Prague is open daily from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The Jewish Museum in Prague is closed on Saturdays and on Jewish holidays.

The National Gallery is open daily except Mondays from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Shops are generally open Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. or later. Many shops are also open on Saturdays, usually until noon or early afternoon. Banks are typically open from 8 a.m. to 5 or 6 p.m., Monday to Friday. Food stores usually open around 8 a.m., and many stay open until the evening, including on Saturdays. Large supermarkets and some hypermarkets (for example Tesco) may be open 24 hours a day.

Good tip for you: don't be late

LANGUAGE ISSUE

The official language of the Czech Republic is Czech, and while many people can speak English, not everyone will. It helps to learn a few useful Czech phrases before you arrive. This can make your experience easier and even bring a smile to people's faces when they see you trying to speak their language.

USE OF COMPUTERS/INTERNET



All International students have an access to the computer within the University of South Bohemia. The access is enabled by using the guest identification card, which will be given to each international student at his/her arrival to České Budějovice. Within the student residences, there is a possibility to use the internet for a charge as there are internet connections at each room.

The University of South Bohemia is part of Edu roam, world-wide roaming access service.

HEALTH AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

Visitors from EU / EEA / Switzerland

Visitors from EU countries plus Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland are entitled to the provision of necessary and urgent health care free-of-charge.

It is necessary to have a [European Health Insurance Card](#).

However, it is strongly recommended to arrange additional travel insurance, which should cover medical treatment, hospitalization, repatriation, liability insurance (recommended for teaching or clinical activities)

The insurance should be arranged before departure from the home country.



Visitors from non-EU countries

Visitors from non-EU countries must have valid travel medical insurance covering the entire period of stay in the Czech Republic. For stays requiring a visa or residence permit, the insurance must meet the conditions set by Czech law. In general, the insurance must cover:

- ♥ emergency medical care
- ♥ hospitalization
- ♥ medical evacuation or repatriation
- ♥ minimum coverage of at least 60,000 EUR per insured event

Visitors are advised to verify the insurance requirements with the Czech Embassy or Consulate in their country before travelling.

STRUCTURE OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN CZECH REPUBLIC

Higher education in the Czech Republic is provided by university and non-university institutions. Non-university institutions mainly offer Bachelor's programmes, while universities provide Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral programmes.

Most higher education institutions are public universities funded by the state through the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports. In addition, there are also private universities and four state higher education institutions (military universities and the Police Academy).

All higher education institutions offer accredited study programmes, which are regularly evaluated by national accreditation authorities. The main language of instruction is Czech, but the number of programmes taught in English and other foreign languages is increasing, especially for international students.

Degree Structure

Since 2001, the Czech higher education system has followed the three-cycle structure used across Europe.

Bachelor's Degree (Bc., BcA.)

Bachelor programmes usually last 3–4 years (180–240 ECTS credits).

They provide basic academic education and professional preparation.

Studies end with a final state examination and the defence of a Bachelor thesis. Graduates may either enter the labour market or continue to a Master's programme.

Master's Degree (Mgr., Ing., MgA. and others)

Master programmes usually last 2–3 years after a Bachelor's degree, or 4–6 years in long programmes such as medicine or architecture.

Studies focus on advanced theoretical knowledge and professional specialization. Students complete their studies with a state examination and the defence of a Master's thesis.

Doctoral Degree (Ph.D.)

Doctoral programmes represent the highest level of higher education and usually last 3–4 years.

They focus on independent research and scientific work under the supervision of a tutor. Studies are completed with a doctoral examination and the defence of a dissertation.
